Junior Bryson Galloway threw a school record seven touchdown passes as homestanding North East stormed past Franklin, 68-0, Friday, handing the winless Knights their fifth loss.

Galloway threw six scoring passes in the first half alone as the Grape Pickers took a 55-0 lead into the locker room.

His seventh TD pass came early in the third quarter and gave him 13 for the season.

Carter Crozier caught five TDs, another school record, including one in the fourth quarter from Jayden Wittman. Crozier's sixth and final catch Friday was the 100th of his career (1,115 yards).

Oddly, despite all the TDs, the Pickers passed for only 138 yards. They ran for 192, so total offense doesn't really match the final score. (Seven FHS turnovers at work.)

The Knights, who were playing without Caden Mincer, lost the ball six times on fumbles.

Mincer sat out the second half against General McLane last week.

Franklin did put together a drive in the fourth quarter, but Connor Ritchey's 35-yard field goal attempt missed the mark.
